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A MAN from South Cheshire has been nominated for a coveted Cystic Fibrosis Breathing Life Award.

Chris Benbow, of Langley Drive, Crewe, has been nominated for the artistic category in the awards which celebrate the outstanding achievements of inspiring people that have Cystic Fibrosis, the UK's most common life-threatening inherited disease.

The 21-year-old will be attending a star-studded awards ceremony in London at the end of this month at the Hilton Metropole.

Chris is a keen photographer and was short-listed for the final of Digital Photographer of the Year 2008. He has developed his own unique style where he captures outdoor abandoned areas at night.

This unusual and creative approach requires imaginative lighting for highly atmospheric shots. Chris fits his Cystic Fibrosis treatment around his night shoots and is going to university in September to study photography.

Each award recognises the exceptional accomplishments of those suffering with Cystic Fibrosis shown in the areas of sport, art, academia, fundraising and fighting spirit. There are 21 nominees from across the country.
